If you fail 70% of the time, you are one of the best players in the game. You have to handle that mentally.
So it's not like you go into something afraid of it.
You go into it respecting it, but also working and excited by it."*

You CANNOT be afraid to fail!


Fear of failure is the biggest roadblock to success in ANYTHING,
